When Meme and her four kittens came to us, they were anemic and covered in fleas. Poor Meme had ear mites too. All the kittens' eyes were so gunky they were glued shut.

We were determined to get them back on their paws as soon as possible. Meme and her kittens were given eye treatment and antibiotics, while Meme was also treated for her ear problem. Then they were wormed and vaccinated.

Today, they're thriving in loving homes and enjoying their second chance at life.

Lucy's story

Lucy's owners contacted us through their local food bank. They had been ill and were struggling to cover the costs of raising a family and caring for Lucy.

Our outreach team visited Lucy and her owners at home, and discussed ways we could help. We also carried out a health check on Lucy and found some discharge and milk coming from her teats.

After talking with her owners about getting her neutered, we then offered them a voucher to help cover the cost. While a local vet was carrying out the operation, they discovered Lucy had an infection in her womb. It turned out this had been causing her health problems. Lucy recovered quickly and, with support from Woodgreen, got to stay in her own home.

Your chance to help pets live their best life

There are so many things you can do to raise vital funds for Woodgreen. Here are just a few ideas to get you started.

Pet walkathon

Organise a group dog walk and ask participants to pay an entrance fee or get sponsored to join in. Ask your local pet-related business to sponsor the event.



Dog or pet show

Make it a stand-alone event or part of a bigger event like a fete or sports day, and include even more ways of fundraising such as food stalls and children's activities.

Challenge event

Have a go at a sponsored run, cycle or swim - or something different if you fancy a new challenge. Get your friends involved and you can train together and keep each other motivated.

Karen took part in a half marathon in 2018 and signed up for the London Marathon in 2020. Overall she's raised almost £3.000.

Personal challenge

Try giving up something for a week - or even a month. Alternatively, challenge someone else to do it and then make a donation on their behalf.

Job swap

Offer to sponsor your manager to spend the morning answering customer enquiries. Or try auctioning the CEO's job for a couple of hours. This could raise a lot of money, especially if you ask your company to match what you raise.

Games tournament

This could be heaps of fun! Get some friends together for a mammoth session of cards, a board game like Monopoly, Trivial Pursuit, or your favourite video game.

How to boost your fundraising

Here are some top tips to help take your online fundraising to the next level.

Make it personal

Set up your own online fundraising page by going to a page like JustGiving. com/Woodgreen and adding photos and personal stories.

Tell it like it is

Add some facts about what we do at Woodgreen, so that people have a clear understanding of the amazing difference their donation will make.

Getting into the spirit of changing pets' lives

We're always grateful when businesses make a donation towards our vital work. Among them is The Alchemist – a bar and restaurant in London. They raised a whopping £1,717 through customer donations added on top of their bill over the course of one month. If you have a business and would like to do something similar, get in touch!

3 Set a target

Fundraisers with targets raise more. Once you hit your target, put it up to encourage even more donations.

Ask your friends and family

People tend to match previous donations, so ask your loved ones to sign up first and set the bar high.

Spread the word

Don't be shy! Tell everyone what you're doing through Facebook, Twitter and Instagram – and include a link in your email signature.



Keep it safe and legal

Follow the rules

If you hold a raffle or lottery, you might need a licence from your local council. Check in with our fundraising team who can help before you start.

Think about health and safety

It's crucial that you make sure your chosen venue is safe, so it's a good idea to do a risk assessment. Think about inviting a charity such as St John's Ambulance to provide first aid on the day too

Insurance

We strongly recommend taking out public liability insurance for any event involving the public. Start by checking whether your venue has the insurance you need. Better to be safe than sorry!
